Ongoing picks criteria include a minimum of three years of data in AgriLife wheat variety trials across numerous annual locations.

As noted before, a "Pick" variety means this: given the data these are the varieties we would choose to include and emphasize on our farm for wheat grain production. Picks are not necessarily the numerical top yielders as important disease resistance traits (leaf or stripe rust, wheat streak mosaic virus), insect tolerance (greenbugs, Hessian fly), or standability can also be important varietal traits that enable a producer to better manage single-variety potential risk using a "mix and match" approach to variety selection to cover basic defensive traits on your farm.
