<b>Bushel</b>	A machine that cuts, separates and cleans grain all at one time.
<b>Bran</b>	A person or machine involved in the process of grinding grain into flour.
<b>Grain Drill</b>	The starchy middle layer of the wheat kernel. It is ground into flour and contains carbohydrates, protein and vitamins.
<b>Grain Elevator</b>	The amount of grain harvested per unit area, typically measured in bushels per acre for wheat farming.
<b>Endosperm</b>	The nutrient-dense embryo of the wheat plant, located within the kernel.
<b>Harvest</b>	A unit of measurement that equals 4,840 square yards and used to measure land.
<b>Combine</b>	A place where wheat is stored and sold.
<b>Acre</b>	A unit of dry volume measurement used primarily in agriculture to quantify harvested crops.
<b>Germ</b>	A machine used to plant wheat.
<b>Miller</b>	The outermost protective layer of the wheat kernel, rich in fiber and nutrients. It is separated during milling to produce refined flour.
<b>Header</b>	Cutting and gathering the crop when it is ripe.
<b>Yield</b>	The front part of a combine harvester that cuts and gathers standing grain crops.
